

Streetsbrook Infant & Nursery School
How we used our Pupil Premium Allocation in 2013-14

Streetsbrook received a total Pupil Premium allocation of £9,898 in 2013-14. This was based on the number of children in our school who were eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). We used the additional funding in a number of ways including:

- A contribution towards the cost of additional Teaching Staff to enable children in Years 1 and 2 to be taught in smaller groups for English and Maths
- A contribution towards the cost of additional Teaching Support Staff to lead specific targeted interventions for small groups of children, including BEAM, Write-Dance, ELS, Sentence Building, Numicon and a Social Group to develop listening skills, confidence and self-esteem
- Enabling access to extended school provision, visits and residential trips

The impact that this had on the achievement of those children is tabled below:

In 2014-15, we will receive a Pupil Premium allocation of £14,900. Our plans for its use include:

- A contribution towards employing an additional qualified and experienced teacher to teach Literacy & Numeracy in Year 2
- Additional targeted assistance from teaching support staff in Year One classrooms
- Targeted intervention in Year 1 e.g. ELS (Early Literacy support), 1-1 Reading, Phonics, Numicon, Write Dance, BEAM, Social Groups
- Enabling access to extended school provision e.g. After School clubs
- Subsidising/contributing towards educational visits including Residential trips

If you are currently in receipt of one of the following:

- income support
- jobseekers allowance (income based)
- employment and support allowance (income related)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an income that does not exceed £16,190
- guaranteed element of state pension credit
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
