

Streetsbrook Infant and Early Years Academy
Sports Funding 2017-18

The Government is providing funding of £320 million in 2017/18 to support and enhance the quality of sport in primary schools and in developing healthy lifestyles. This is as a result of **the predicted revenue generated** by the Sugar Tax Levy.

Allocation

Funding for schools has been calculated on the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) based on the annual census figures.

Based on a full year, all schools with 17 more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. This will mean Streetsbrook receiving a total of £16,600

For the Academic Year 2016/17 the grant was used in the following ways:

Academic Year 2017-18

In May 2017, Streetsbrook received a grant of £6,917 for school sports. An additional £9683 will be received in November. This money has been allocated in a number of ways to support the on-going development and quality of sports and PE for all children.
