Mrs P from Cranmore led the session and we learnt so much about 'chitting' potatoes and planting marigolds as an organic pest deterrent to other plants. All of the parents/grandparents and children made handmade paper plugs and added soil and seeds. The choice of planting options included sweetcorn, beans, and marigolds.



Can you spot the school milk cartons - a great recycling method! Cut off the top and ensure there are drainage holes, fill with soil and off we go, planting the green way!
